BYLAWS
ARTICLE 1

## Introductory Provisions

Section I. 1 Applicability. These Bylaws provide for the governance of THE STRIP LOFT'S CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION ("Association") pursuant to the requirements of Section 3305 of the Act with respect to the Condominium created by the recording of the Declaration among the land records of Allegheny County, Pennsylvania at Deed Book Volume l0329. Page 447.

Section 1.2 Definitions. Capitalized terms used herein without definition shall have the meanings specified for such terms in the Declaration to which these Bylaws pertain or, if not defined therein, the meanings apecified or used for such terms in the Act.

Section 1.3 Compliance. Pursuant to the provisions of the act, every Unit Owner and all Pereons entitled to occupy a Onit shall comply with thebe Bylawa.

Section 1.4 offifce. The office of the Condominium, the Association, and the Executive Board shall be located at the Property (as defined in Declaration recorded simultaneous herewith) or at ouch other place as may be designated from time to time by the Executive Board.

Section 1.5 Incorporation of Statutorv Law. Except as expregsly provided herein, in the Declaration, or in the Act, the Asaociation shall be governed by the proviaions of the Non-profit Corporation Law of 1988 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 15 Pa . C.S. $\$ 5101$ et seq., at it may be amended from time to time (the "Corporation Law"). The "Board of Directors" described therein shall be referred to herein and in the Declaration as the "Executive Board."

## ARTICLE 2 <br> The Association

Section 2.1 Composition. The Association is hereby organized as a non-profit corporation in the Comnonwealth of Pennsylvania under the Nonprofit Corporation Act of 1988, on a non-stock basia. The Association shall consigt of all of the Unit Owners acting as a group in accordance with the Act, the Declaration and these Bylaws. The Association ahall have the responsibility of administering the Condominium, establisining the means and methods of collecting assegsments and charges, arranging for the management of the Condominium and performing all of the other 'acts that may be required or permitted to be performed by the Association pursuant to the Act and the Declaration. The foregoing responsibilities shall be performed by the Executive Board or Managing Agent as more particularly set forth in these Bylaws.

Section 2.2 Annual Meetinga. The annual meetings of the Association shall be held on the third Wednesday of April of each year, beginning in 1999, unless such date shall occur on a holiday, in which event the meeting ahall be held on the gucceeding Monday. At such annual meetinga the Executive Board shall be elected by ballot of the Unit Owners in accordance with the requirements of Section 3.3 of these Bylaws (subject to pertinent provisions of the Declaration) and such other business as may properly come before the meeting may be_transacted

Section 2,3 Place of Meetings. Meetings of the Assodiation shall be held at the principal office of the Association or at such other suitable place convenient to the Unit Owners as may be designated by the Executive Board.

## Section 2.4 Special Meetinga/Declarant Control.

2.4.1 The President shall call a special meeting of the Agsociation if вo directed by resolution of the Executive Board or upon a petition gigned and preaented to the Secretary by Unit ownerg entitled to cast at least twenty-five (254) percent of the votes in the Assoctation. The notice of any apecial meeting shall state the time, place and purpose thereof. Such meeting shall be held within forty-five (45) days after receipt by the President of aaid resolution or petition; provided, however, if the purpose includes the consideration of the rejection of a budget or capital expenditure pursuant to Section 5.a below, such meeting ahall be held within fifteen (15) days after receipt by the President of said resolution or petition. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting except as stated in the notice.
2.4.2 Within sixty (60) days after conveyance of twenty-five (25\%) percent of the Units to Unit Owners other than the Declarant, the Executive Board shall direct that a special meeting of the Aasociation be held at which two (2) of the five (5) members of the Executive Board designated by the Declarant shall fesign (such memberg to be selected by the Declarant), and the Unit Owners, excluding the Declarant as a Unit owner, shall thereupon elect succeasor members of the Executive Eoard to act in the place and stead of the members resigning. Such successor members shall serve until the second annual meeting of the Association following the meeting at which they were elected.
2.4.3 The percentage of Units conveyed as referred to in this section and otherwige in these Bylaws is presumed to be that percentage determined as if all the Unita that Declarant has built or reserved the right to build were included in the Condominium.
2.4.4 Within aixty days immediately preceding the date by which all Declarant appointed members of the Executive Board must reaign pursuant to $\$ 12.6 .3$ of the Declaration, a epecial meeting of the Association shall be held at which all of the members of the Executive Board ohall resign, and the Unit Owners, including the Declarant if the Declarant owns one or more Units, shall thereupon elect succesaor members of the Executive Board to act in the place and stead of those resigning. The two successor members receiving the highest numbers of votes shall serve until the third annual meeting of membership following such election, the two guccessor members receiving tho next highest numbers of votes shall serve until the second annual meeting of membershtp following such election, and the gucceasor member receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve until the next annual meeting of membership.
2.4.5 Notwithstanding the foregoing, if any meeting required pursuant to aubsections 2.4 .2 and 2.4 .4 above could be held on the date an annual meeting of the Association is scheduled, then such meeting(s) shall be held concurrently with such anmual meeting.

Section 2.5 Notice of Meetings. The Secretary ghall give to each Unit owner a notice of each annual or regularly-scheduled meeting of the Association at least twenty but nor more than sixty days, and of each special meeting of the Unit Owners at least ten but not more than forty-five days, prior to such meeting, stating the time, place and purpose thereof. The giving of a notice of meeting in the manner provided in this Section and Section 日. 1 of these Bylaws shall be considered service of notice. The notice of any meeting must state the time and place of the meeting and the items on the agenda, including the general nature of any oroposed amendment to the Declaration or the Bylaws, any budget or assesgment changes and, any proposal to remove an executive board member or officer.

Section 2.6 Adjournment of Meetinga. If at any meeting of the Association a quorum is not present, Onit Owners entitled to cast a majority of the votea represented at such meeting may adjourn the meeting to a time not less than forty-eight hours after the time for which the original meeting was called.

Section 2.7 Voting. Voting of all meetings of the Association shall be on a percentage basis and the percentages of the vote to which each Onit Owner is entitled ahall be the percentage Interest assigned to his unit in the Declaration. If the Owner of a Unit is a corporation, joint venture, partnership or unincorporated association, the nature person who shall be entitled to cast the vote for such Unit shall be the person named in a Certificate executed by auch entity pursuant to ita governing documents. If the Owner of a Unit is a trust, the Truatee or Truatees shall be deemed to be the owner for the voting purposes. Where the ownership of a Unit is in more than one person, the natural person who shall be entitled to cast the vote of such Unit shall be the person named in a Certificate executed by all of the owners of guch Unit and filed with the Secretary or, in the absence of auch named person from the meeting or the failure to execute and file auch a Certificate, the person who shall be entitied to cast the vote of such Unit ahall be the person owning such Unit who is present. If more than one of the multiple owners are pregent, the votes allocated to the Unit may be cast only in accordance with their unanimous agreement unless the Declaration expressly provides otherwise. There shall be deemed to be unanimous agreement if any one of the multiple owners casts the votes allocated to that Unit without protest being made promptly to the person preaiding over the meeting by any of the other ownerg of the Unit. Suci Certificate ghall be valid until revoked by a subsequent Certificate similarly executed. Except where execution by owners of a Unit in the same manner as the Deed is required and gubject to the provisions of the Declaration and Bylaws, where ever the approval or disapproval of a Unit Owner is required by the Declaration or the Eylaws, such approval or disapproval shall be made only by the person who would be entitled to cast the vote of such Unit at any meeting of the Association. Subject to the requirements of the Act, wherever the approval or disapproval of a Unit Owner is required by the Act, the Declaration or these Bylaws, such approval or disapproval shall be made only by the person who would be entitled to cast the vote of such Unit at any meeting of the Association. Except with respect to election of members of the Executive Board and except where a greater number is required by the Act, the Declaration or these Bylaws, the owners of more than fifty percent (50\%) of the aggregate Fercentage Interesta in the Condominium voting in person or by proxy at one time at a duly convened meeting at which a quorum is present is required to adopt decisions at any meeting of the Association. Any specified percentage of the Unit Owners means the Unit Owners, including Declarant. In all elections for Executive Board members, each Unit Owner shall be entitled to cast for each vacancy to be filled at such election the number of votes allocated to the Unit or Unita owned by such Unit Owner as provided in the Declaration. Those candidates for election receiving the greatest number of votes cast in such elections shall be elected and, if Executive Board members are being elected to unequal terms, the candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected to the longest term. Except as set forth in subsections 2.4.2, if the Declarant owns or holds title to one or more Units, the Declarant shall have the right at any meeting of the Association to cast the votes to which such Unit or Units are entitled. No votes allocated to a Unit owned by the Association may be cast. There shall be no cumulative or class voting.

Section 2.8 proxieg. A vote may be cast in person or by proxy. If a Unit is owned by more than one person, each Owner of the unit may vote or register protest to the casting of votes by the other Owners of the Unit through a duly executed proxy. Such proxy may be granted by any Unit owner in favor of only another Unit Owner, a holder of a mortgage on a Unit or the Deciarant. Proxies shall be duly executed in writing, ahall be valid only for the particular meeting designated therein and must be filed with the Secretary before the appointed time of the meeting. Such proxy shall be deemed revoked
only upon actual receipt by the Person presiding over the meeting of written notice of revocation from the grantor(s) of the proxy. No proxy shall be valid for a period in excess of one year after the execution thereof. A proxy is void if it is not dated or purports to be revocable without notice.

Section 2.9 Quorum. Except as set forth below, the presence in person or by proxy of Unit owners of twenty (20\%) percent or more of the aggregate Percentage Interests at the commencement of a meeting shall constitute a quorum of all meetings of the Asoociation. If a meeting is adjourred pursuant to Section 2.6 above, the quorum at. such second meeting shall be deemed pregent throughout any meeting of the Association if persons entitled to cast ten (10\%) percent of the votes which may be cast for the election of the Executive Board are preaent in person or by proxy at the beginning of the meeting.

Section 2.10Conduct of Meetings. The Preaident (or in his or her absence, one of the vice-presidents) shall preside over all meetings of the Association and the Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meeting and record in a minute book all resolutions adopted at the meeting as well as a record of all transactions occurring thereat. The President may appoint a person to serve as parliamentarian at any meeting of the Association. The then current edition of Robert'g Rules of Order shall govern the conduct of all meetinga of the Association when not in conflict with the Declaration, these Bylawn or the Act. All votes shall be tallied by tellers appointed by the President.

ARTICLE 3
Executive Board
Section 3.1 Number and oualification. The affairs of the Association shall be governed by an Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be composed of five (5) natural persons, all of whom shall be Unit owners or designees of the Declarant.

Section 3.2 Declarant Control. There ahall be a period of Declarant control as provided in Section 12.6.3 of the Declaration. During the period of Declarant control, the Declarant or peraons designated by the Declarant, shall have the power to appoint and remove officers and members of the Executive Board.

Section 3.3 Delegation of Powerg; Managing Agent. The Executive Board may employ for the Condominium a "Maraging Agent" at a compensation established by the Executive Board. The Managing Agent shall perform such duties and services as the Executive Board shall authorize, including, but not limited to, all of the duties listed in the Act, the Declaration and these Bylaws; provided, however, where a Managing Agent does not have the power to act under the Act, the Declaration or these Bylawo, such duties shall be performed as advisory to the Executive Board. The Executive Board may delegate to the Managing Agent all of the powers granted to the Executive Board by the Act, the Declaration and these Bylaws other than the following powers:

| 3.3 .1 | to adopt the arinual budget and any amendment thereto or to assegs any Common Expenses; |

Any contract with the Managing Agent must provide that it may be temminated with cause on no more than thirty days' written notice and without cause on no more than ninety days' written notice. The term of any such contract may not exceed one year.

## Section 3.4 glection and Term of Office.

3.4.1 At the annual meeting of the Association, subject to Article 12 of the Declaration, the election of members of the Executive Board shall be held. The term of office of any Executive Board member to be elected (except as set forth in Sections 2.4.2 and 2.4.4 hereof) shall be fixed at three years. The members of the Executive Board shall hold office until the earlier to occur of the election of their respective successors or their death, adfudication of incompetency, removal, or resignation. An Executive Board member may serve as unlimited number of terms and may succeed himself.
3.4.2 Persons qualified to be members of the Executive Board may be nominated for election only as follows:
3.4.2.1 Any Unit Owner may submit to the Secretary at least thirty days before the meeting at which the election is to be held a nominating petition aigned by Unit Owners owning at least ten Units in the aggregate, together with a statement that the person nominated is willing to serve on the Executive Board and a biographical sketch of the nominee. The Secretary shall mail or hand deliver the aubmitted items to every Unit Owner along with the notice of such meeting; and
3.4.2.2 Nominations may be submitted from the Floor at the meeting at which the election is held for each vacancy on the Executive Board for which no more than one person has been nominated by petition.

Section 3.5 Removal or Reaimation of Membera of the Executive Board. Except with respect to members designated by the Declarant, at any regular or special meeting of the Association duly called, any one or more of the members of the Executive Board may be removed with or without cause by Unit Owners entitled to cast a majority of all votes in the Association and a auccessor may then and there by elected to fill the vacancy thus created. Any Unit owner proposing removal of a Board member shall give notice thereof to for Secretary. Any member whose removal has been proposed by a Unit Owner shall be given at least ten days' notice by the Secretary of the time, place and purpose of the meeting and shall be given an opportuntty to be heard at the meeting. A member of the Executive Board may resign at any time and shall be deemed to have resigned upon tranafer of title to his Unit. The Declarant shall have the right to remove and replace any or all members appointed by the Declarant at any time and from time to time until the required resignation date specified in Section 12.6.3 of the Declaration.
section 3.6 Vacancies. Except as set forth in Section 3.4 above with respect to members appointed by the Declarant, vacancies in the Executive Board caused by any reason other than the removal of a member by a vote of Unit
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 meeting fialy conatitute leas than a quorum. Each person so elected shall be a member of the Executive Board for the remainder of the term of the member being replaced and until a successor shall be elected at the next annual meeting of the Association at which auch seat is to be filled upon expiration of the term of his predecessor. In the case of multiple vacancies, the member receiving the greatest number of votes shall be elected for the longest term.

Section 3.7 Orqanization Meeting. The first meeting of the Executive Board following each annual meeting of the Aseociation shall be held within ten days thereafter at such time and place as shall be fixed by the President (even if he is the outgoing President) at the meeting at which auch Executive Board ahall have been elected, and no notice aball be neceasary to the newly elected members of the Executive Board in order legally to constitute auch meeting, if a majority of the Executive Board members ahall be present at such meeting.

Section 3.8 Recular Meeting日. Regular meetings of the Executive Board may be held at such eime and place as shall be determined from time to time by a majority of the members, but such meetings shall be held at least every four months during each fiscal year. Notice of regular meetings of the Executive Board shall be given to each member, by mail or telecopy, at least three business days prior to the day named for such meeting.

Section 3.9 Special Meetinas. Special meetings of the Executive Board may be called by the President on at least three business days' notice to each member, given by mail or telecopy, which notice shall state the time, place and purpose of the meeting. Special meetings of the Executive Board shall be called by the President or Secretary in like manner and on like notice on the written request of at least two (2) members of the Executive Board.

Section 3.10 Waiver of Notice. Any member may at any time, in writing, waive notice of any meeting of the Executive Board, and such waiver shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of guch notice. Attendance by a member at any meeting of the Executive Board shall constitute a waiver of notice by him of the time, place and purpose of such meeting. If all members are present at any metting of the Executive Board, no notice shall be required and any business may be transacted at such meeting.

Section 3.11 quorum of the Executive Board. At all meetinge of the Executive Board a majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of buginess, and the votes of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which a quorum is pregent shall constitute the deciaion of the Executive Board. If at any meeting of the Executive Board there shall be less than a quorum present, a majority of those present may adjourn the meeting from time to time. At any auch adjourned meeting at which a quorum is present, any business which might have been transacted at the meeting originally called may be transacted without further notice. One or more members of the Executive Board may participate in and be counted for quorum purposes at any moeting by means of conference telephone or similar communication equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other.

Section 3.12Compenation. No member of the Executive Board shall receive any compensation from the Aasociation. For acting as such, but may be reimburged for any expenses incurred in the performance of his duties.

Section 3.13Conduct of Meetings. The President shall preside over all meetings of the Executive Board and the Secretary shall keep a minute book of the Executive Board meetings, recording therein all resolutiong adopted by the Executive Board and a record of all transactions and proceedings occurring at such meetings. The then current edition of Robert's Rules of Order shali govern the conduct of the meetings of the Executive Board if and to the extent not in conflict with the Declaration, these Bylaws or the Act.

Section 3.14Action Without Meeting. Any action by the Executive Board required or permitted to be taken at any meeting may be taken without a meeting if all of the members of the Executive Board ghall individually or collectively consent in writing to such action. Any such written consent shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings-of the Pxeeutive-Board

Section 3.15Validity of Contracts with Interested Executive Board Members. No contract or other transaction between the Association and one or
more of its Executive Board members or between the Association and any corporation, firm or association in which one or more of the Executive Board members are directors or officers, or are financialiy interented, shall be void or voidable because such Executive Board member or members are present at any meeting of the Executive Board which authorized or approved the contract or transaction or because his or their votes are counted, if the circumstances specified in either of the following subparagraphs exists;
3.15.1 The fact that an Executive Board member is also such a director or officer or has auch financial interest is disclosed or known to the Executive Board and 'is noted in the minutes thereof, and the Executive Board authorizes, approves or ratifies the contract or transaction in good faith by a vote sufficient for the purpose without counting the vote or votes of auch Executive Board member or members; or
3.15.2 The contract or transaction is made in good faith and is not unconscionable to the Association at the time it is authorized, approved or ratified.

Section 3.16 Inclusion of Interested Board Members in the Ouorum. Any Executive Board member holding auch director or officer position or having such financial interest in another corporation, firm or association may be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at a meeting of the Executive Board or a comittee thereof which authorizes, approves or ratifies a contract or trangaction of the type described in Section 3.15 hereof.

## ARTICLE 4 Officers

Section 4.1 Desionation. The princtpal officers of the Association shall be the Preaident, the Vice President, the Secretary and the Treasurer, 211 of whom shall be elected by the Executive Board. The Executive Board may appoint one or more assistant treasurers, assistant secretaries and such other officers as in its judgment may be necessary. The President and Vice President shall be members of the Executive Board. Any other officers must be Unit Owners or members of the Executive Board. An officer other than the President may hold more than one office.

Section 4.2 Election of Officers. The officers of the Association shal. be elected annually by the Executive Board at the organizational meeting of each new boafd and ghall hold office at the pleasure of the Executive Board.

Section 4.3 Removal of Officers. Upon the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the Executive Board, any officer may be removed, either with or without cause, and a successor may be elected at any meeting of the Executive Board called for such purpose.

Section 4.4 president. The President shall be the chief executive of the Association, preside at all meetings of the Association and of the Executive Board and have all of the general powers and duties which are incident to the office of president of a corporation orgarized under the laws of Pennsylvania including without limitation the power to appoint committees from among the Unit Owners from time to time as the President may in his or her discretion decide is appropriate to asgist in the conduct of the affairs of the Association. The President shall cease holding auch office at such time as ahe ox he ceases to be a member of the Executive Board.

Section 4.5 Vice President. The Vice President shall take the place of the President and perform all duties of the President whenever the Dresident shall be absent or unable to act. If neither the President nor the Vice President ís able to act, Ehe Executive- Board shall appoint some other member of the Executive Board to act in the place of the President, on an interim basis. The Vice President shall also perform such other duties as shall from time to time be delegated or assigned by the Executive Board or by
the president. The Vice President shall cease holding such office at such time as she or he ceases to be a member of the Executive Board.

Section 4.6 Secretary. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Association and of the Executive Board, have charge of such books and papers as the Executive Board may direct, maintain a register setting for the place to which all notices to Unit Owners and holders of mortgages on any Units hereunder shall be delivered and, in general, perform all dutiea incident to the office of secretary of a corporation organized under the laws of Pennsylvania. The Secretary shall, upon request, provide any person, or cause to be provided to ariy person entitled thereto, a written atatement or certification of the information required to be provided by the Association pursuant to Sections $3315(\mathrm{~g}), 3407(\mathrm{a})$ and $3407(\mathrm{~b})$ of the Act and Sections 5.9 and 5.11 below.

Section 4.7 Treasurer. The Treasurer shall have the responsibility for the safekeeping of association funds and aecurities, be responsible for keeping full and accurate financial records and bookg of account showing all receipts and disbursements, and for the preparation of all required financiai data, and be responsible for the deposit of all monies in the name of the Executive Board, the Assoctation or the Managing Agent, in guch depositories as may from time to time be designated by the Executive Board and, in general, perform all the duties incifent to the office of treasurer of a corporation organized under the laws of Penngylvania.

Section 4.8 Execution of Documents. All agreements, contracts, deeds, leases, checks and other instruments of the Association for expenditures or obligations in excess of $\$ 2,000$ shall be executed by any two (2) officers of the Association. All auch ingtruments for expenditures or obligations of $\$ 2,000$ or less may be executed by any one (1) officer of the Association.

Section 4.9 Compensation of officerg. No officer or member of the Executive Board shall receive any compensation from the Association for acting as such, but may be reimbursed for any out-of-pocket expenses incurred in performing his or her duties.

## ARTICLE 5 <br> Common Expenses; Budgets

Section 5.1 Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Association shall be the calendar year unless otherwise detexmined by the Executive Board; provided, however, that the firgt fiscal year shall begin upon the registration of the Association with the Department of state of the Comonwealth of Pennaylvania.

Section 5.2 Preparation and Approval of Budget.
5.2.1. On or before the first day of November of each year for sixty days before the beginning of the fiscal year if the fiscal year is other than the calendar year), the Executive Board shall adopt an anmal budget for the Association containing an estimate of the total amount considered necessary to pay the cost of maintenance, management, operation, repair and replacement of the Common Elements and those parts of the Unita as to which it is the responsibility of the Executive Board to maintain, repair and replace, the cost due to The Strip Lofts Condominium Association for the use of its recreational areas by the Unit Owners, and the cost of wages, materials, fngurance premiums, services, supplies and other expenses that may be declared to be Common Expensea by the Act, the Declarazion, these Bylaws or a resolution of the Association and which will be required during the ensuing fiscal year for the administration, operation, maintenance and repair of the Droperty and the rendering to the Unit owners of all related services. such budget shall also include such reasonable amounts as the Executive Board conaiders necessary to provide working capital, a general operating reserve and
reserves ₹or contingencies and replacement. The budget shall segregate General Common Expenses and Limited Expenses, if any.
5.2.2. On or before the next succeeding fifth day of November (fifty-five days before the beginning of the fiscal year if the fiscal year is other than the calendar year), the Executive Board shall make the budget available for inspection at the Assoctation office and shall send to each Unit Owner a copy of the budget in a reasomably itemized form that sets forth the amount of the Common Expenses (which ahall include the amount to be paid to The strip Lofts Condominium Association as hereinbefore provided). Such budget shall constitute the basis for determining each Unit Owners' assessments for General Common Expenses and Limited Expenses of the Association and shall automatically take effect at the beginning of the fiscal year for which it is adopted, subject to Section 5.8 below.
5.2.3. The Executive Board shall make reagonable efforts to meet the deadlines set forth above, but complyance with such deadlines shall not be a condition precedent to the effectiveness of any budget.

## Section 5.3 Assessment and Payment of Common Expenses.

5.3.1 General Common Expense日. The Executive Board shall calculate the monthly assessmenta for General Comon Expense日 againat each Unit by dividing the estimated funds required by the number of unite and assessing each Unit equally or by multiplying (a) the total amount of the estimated funda required for the operation of the property (including the property belonging to The Strip Lofts Condominium Association) set forth in the budget adopted by the Executive Board for the fiscal year in question, after deducting ary Limited Expenses and income expected to be received from sources other than Common Expenses assessments by (b) the Percentage Interest (expressed in decimal form) allocated to such Unit, and dividing the resultant product by (c) the number of calendar months in such fiscal year. Such assessments shall be deemed to have been adopted and assessed or a monthly basis and not on an annual basis payable in monthly installments, shall be due and payable on the first day of each calendar month and shall be a lien against each Unit Owner's Unit as provided in the Act and the Declaration. Within ninety days after the end of each fiscal year, the Executive Board shall prepare and deliver to each onit owner and to each record holder of a mortgage on a Unit who has registered an address with the secretary an itemized account of the Common Expenses and funds received during such fiscal year less expenditures actually incurred and sums paid into regerves. Any net shortage with regard to Generai Common Expenseb, after application of such reserves as the Executive Board may determine, shall be assessed promotly against the unit owners in accordance with their percentage Interests and shall be payable in one or more monthly assessments, as the Executive Board may determine.
5.3.2 Limited Common Expenses. The Executive Board shall calculate the monthly assessmente for Limited Common Expenses against each Unit obligated to pay Limited Common Expensea by multiplying (a) the total amount of the estimated funds required for Limited Expenses set forth in the budget adopted by the Executive Board for the fiscal year in question, after deducting any income expected to be received from the operation of the Limited Common Elements to which the Limited Common Expenses pertain other than Limited Common Expense Assessments, by (b) the share of Limited Conmon Expenses lexpressed in decimal form) ailocated to each such Unit, and dividing the resultant product by (c) the number of calendar months in such fiscal year. Such assessments shall be deemed to have been adopted and assessed on an annual basis payable in monthly installments, shall be due and payable on the first day of each calendar month and shall be a lien against each Unit owner's Unit as provided in the Act and the Declaration. Within ninety days after the end of each fiscal year, the Executive Board shall prepare and deliver to each Unit owner and to each record holder of a mortgage on a Unit who has registered an address with the Secretary an itemized accounting of the Common Expenses and funds
received during such fiscal year less expenditures actually incurred and sums paid into reservea. Any net shortage with regard to Iimited Common Expenses, after application of auch reserves as the Executive Board may determine, shall be assessed promptly against the Unit Owners obligated to pay Limited Common Expenses in accordance with their allocable share of Limited Common Expenses and shall be payable in one or more monthly asseasmenta, as the Executive Board may determine.

### 5.3.3 Reserves. The Executive \#oard shall build up

 and maintain reasonable reserves for working capital, operations, contingencies and replacements. Extraordinary expenditures not originally included in the annual budget which may become necessary during the year may be charged first against auch reserves. If the reserves are deemed to be inadequate for any reason, including non-payment of any Unit Owner's asseasments, the Executive Board may at any time levy further asseasments for General Common Expense and/or LImited Expense which ahall be assegged against the Unit Owners either equally or according to their respective Percentage Interesta with regard to General Common Expenses or in accordance with allocable shares of Limited Expenses with regard to Limited Expenaes (whichever is appropriate), and ahall be payable in one or more monthly assessments as the Executive Board may determine.Section 5.4 Further Assessments. The Executive Board shall serve notice on all Unit owners of any further assessments pursuant to sections 5.3.1, 5.3.2 or 5.3.3 or otherwise as permitted or required by the Act, the Declaration and these Bylaws by a statement in writing giving the amount and reasons therefore, and such further assegsments shall, unless otherwise specified in the notice, become effective with the next monthly agsessment which is due more than ten (10) days after the delivery of such notice of further assessments. All Unit Owners so assessed shall be obligated to pay the amount of such monthly assessments. Such assessants shall be a lien as of the effective date set forth in the preceding Sections 5.3.1, 5.3.2 or 5.3.3.

Section 5.5 Initiel Budget. At or prior to the time assessment of Common Experses commences, the Executive Board shall adopt the budget, as described in this Article, for the period commencing on the date the Executive Board determines that assessments shall begin and ending on the last day of the fiscal year during which auch commencement date occurs. Assessments ahall be levied and become a lien against the Unit Ownerg during such period as is provided herein.

Section 5.6 Delivery of Approved Budget and Notice of Capital Expenditure; Exfect of Failure to Prepare or Adopt Budget. The Executive Board shall deliver to all Jnit Owners copies of each budget approved by the Executive Board and notice of any capital expenditure approved by the Executive Board promptly after each ouch approval. The failure or delay of the Executive Board to prepare or adopt a budget for any fiscal year shall not conatitute a waiver or release in any manner of a Unit Owner's obligation to pay such unit Owner's allocable share of the Comon Expenses as herein provided whenever the same shall be determined and, in the absence of any annual budget or adjusted budget, each Unit Owner shall continue to pay each assessment at the rate estabished for the previous fiscal year until the new annual or adjusted budget shall have beer adopted.

Section 5.7 Accounts; Audite. All sums collected by the Executive Board with respect to assessments againot the Unit Owners or from any other source may be commingled into a single fund. All books and records of the Association shall be kept in accordance with good and accepted accounting practices, and the same shall be audited at least once each year by an 1rdependent-accountant_retained by the Executive Board.

Section 5.3 Rejection of Budqet: Limitations on Expenditures and Borrowing. Anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding, the Association, by majority vote of all votes in the Association, may reject any budget or
capital expenditure approved by the Executive Board, within thirty days after approval by the Executive Board. The power of the Executive Board to expend funds, incur expenses or borrow money on behalf of the Association is subject to the requirement that the consent of Unit Owners entitled to cast at least two-thirds of the votes in the Association obtained at a meeting duly called and held for such purpoge in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws, shall be required to (i) expend funds or incur expenses that it is reasonably anticipated will cause the aggregate amount of all expenaes in the budget (including reserves) to be exceeded by more than $5 \%$ of such aggregate amount after taking into account any projected increases in income, and (ii) to borrow money so that loans of the Association then outstanding would exceed 5t of auch aggregate amount.

Section 5.9 Payment of Common Expenses. Each Unit Owner shali pay the Comon Expensea (including the expenses due to The Strip Lofts Condominium Association for use of the recreational areas belonging to said Condominium Association) assessed by the Executive Board pursuant to the provisions of this Article 5. No Unit Owner may be exempt from liability for contribution toward Common Expenges (including the expenaes due to The Strip Lofts Condominium Association for use of the recreational areas belonging to said Condominium Association) by walver of the use or enjoyment of any of the Common Elements or by abandonment of a Unit. No Unit Owner shall be liable for the payment of any part of the Common Expenses assessed against his or her Unit subsequent to the date or recordation of a conveyance in fee of such Unit. The purchaser of a Unit shall be jointly and severally liable with the Belling Unit Owner for all unpaid assessments against the latter for that Unit's proportionate share of the Common Expenses up to the time of such recordation, without prejudice to the purchaser's right to recover from the selling Unit Owner amounts paid by the purchasex therefore; provided, however, that any such purchaser shall be entitled to a atatement setting forth the amount of the unpaid aseesements against the selling Unit Owner within five days following a written request therefore to the Executive Board or Managing Agent and such purchaser shall not be liable for, nor shall the Unit conveyed be aubject to a lien for any unpaid assessmenta in excess of the amount therein set forth; and, provided further that, subject to section $3315(b)(2)$ of the Act, each record holder of a mortgage on a Un土t which comes into posseasion of a Unit by virtue of foreclosure or by deed or assignment in lieu of foreclosure, or any purchaser at a foreclosure sale, shall take the Unit free of any claims for unpaid assessments or charges against such Unit which accrue prior to the time such holder comes into poseession thereof, except for claims for a pro rata share of such assessments or charges resulting from a pro rata reallocation of such asgessments or charges to all Units including the mortgaged Unit.

Section 5.10Collection of Assespmenta. The Executive Board or the Managing Agent, at the request of the Executive Board, ghall take prompt action to collect any assessments for Common Expenses (including the expenses due to The Strip Lofta Condominium Association for use of the recreational areas belonging to said Condominium Association) due from any Unit Owner which remain unpaid for more than thirty days from the due date for payment thereof. Any assesement not paid within five days after its due date shall accrue a late charge in the amount of five (5\%) percent of the overdue assessment in addition to interest at the rate of fifteen (15\%) percent per annum or such other rate as may be determined by the Executive Board.

Section 5.11Statement of Common Expenses. The Executive Board shall promptly provide any Unit Owner, contract purchaser or proposed mortgagee so requesting the same in writing with a written atatement of all unpaid assessments for Common Expenaes (including assessments for the expenses due to The Strip Lofts Condominium Association for use of the recreational areas belonging to said-Condominium Association) due from such Unit Owner. The Executive Board may impose a reasonable charge for the preparation of such statement to cover the cost of its preparation, to the extent permitted by the Act.

## ARTICLE 6 <br> Compliance and Default

Section 6.1 Relief. Each Unit Owner shall be governed by, and ohall comply with, all of the terms of the Declaration, these Bylaws, the Rules and Regulations and the Act, as any of the same any be amended from time to time. In addition to the remedies provided in the Act and the Declaration, a default by a Unit Owner shal: entitle the Asoociation, acting through its Executive Board or through the Managing Agent, to the following relief:
6.1.1 * Additional Liabllity. Each Unit Owner ahall be liable for the expense of all maintenance, repair or replacement rendered necessary by his act, neglect or carelessneas or the act, neglect or carelessness of his tenants, grests, invitees or licensees, but only to the extent that such expense is not covered by the proceede of insurance carried by the Executive Board. Such liability shall include any increase in casualty insurance premiums occasioned by improper use, misuse, occupancy or abandonment of any Unit or its appurtenances. Nothing contained herein, however, shall be construed as modifying any waiver by any insurance company of its rights of subrogation.
6.1.2 Costa and Attorney's Fees. In any proceedings arising out of any alleged default by a Unit Owner, the prevailing party fhall be entitled to recover the costs of such proceeding and such reasonable attorney's fees as may be determined by the court.
6.1.3 No Waiver of Rights. The failure of the Association, the Executive Board or a Unft Owner to enforce any right, provision, covenant or condition which may be granted by the Declaration, these Bylaws, the Executive Board Rules and Regulations or the Act shall not constitute a waiver of the right of the Association, the Executive Board or the Unit Owner to enforce such right, provision, covenant or condition in the future. All righta, remedies and privileges granted to the Association, the Executive Board or any Unit Owner pursuant to any term, provision, covenant or condition of the Declaration or these Bylaws, the Rules and Regulations or the Act shall be deemed to be cumulative and the exercise of any one or more thereof shall not be deemed to conatitute an election of remediea, nor shall it preclude the party exercising the same from exercioing such other privileges as may be granted to such party by the Declaration, these Bylaws, the Rules and Regulations or the Act or at law or in equity.
6.1.4 Abating and Enjoining Violations by Unit Owners. The violation of any of the Rules and Regulations adopted by the Executive Board, the breach of any Bylaw contained herein or the breach of any provision of the Declaration and Declaration and Establishment of Easements, Conditions, Reservations and Use Restrictions or the Act shall give the Executive Board the right, in addition to any other rights: (a) to enter the Unit in which, or as to which, such violation or breach exists and summarily to abate and remove, at the expense of the defaulting Unit Owner, any structure, thing or condition that may exist therein contrary to the intent and meaning of the provisions hereof, and the Executive Board shall not thereby be deemed guilty in any manmer of trespasa; or (b) to enjoin, abate or remedy by appropriate legal proceedings, either at law or in equity, the continuance of any such breach.

## ARTICLE 7

Amendments
Section 7.1 Amendments to Bylaws. These Bylaws may be modified or amended only by vote of Unit Owners entitled to cast a majority of the votes in the Asaociation, except as otherwise expressly set forth herein or in the Act; provided, however, that until the date on which all Declarant-appointed board members voluntarily resign or are required to resign pursuant to Article 12 of the Declaration, (i) Section 2.4, (ii) Section 3.1, and (iii) this Section 7.1 may not be amended without the consent in writing of Declarant. Additionally,
if any amendment is necessary in the judgment of the Executive Board to cure any ambiguity or to correct or aupplement any provision of theae Bylaws that ing effective, missing or inconsistent with any other provision hereof, or with the Act or the Declaration, or if such amendment is necessary to conform to the requirementa of the Federal National Mortgage Association or the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation with respect to condominium projects, then at any time and from time to time the Executive Board may effect an appropriate corrective amendment without the approval of the Unit Owners or the holders of any liens on all or any part of the Property, upon receipt by the Executive Board of an opinion from independent legal counsel to the effect that the proposed amendment is permitted by the terms of this sentence.

Section 7.2 Approval of Mortqagees. These Bylaws contain provisions concerning various rights and interests of record holders of mortgages on Jitts. Such provialons in theae Bylaws are to be construed as covenante for the protection of such holders on which they may rely in making loans secured by such mortgages. Accordingly, no amendment or modification of these Bylaws impairing or affecting such rights, priorities, remedies or interegts of such a holder shall be adopted without the prior written congent of such holderg who have registered an address with the Secretary.

Section 7.3 Amendmenta to the Declaration. Any two officers or Executive Board members of the Association may prepare, execute, certify and record amendments to the Declaration on behalf of the Association.

ARTICLE 8
Miscellaneous
Section 8.1 Notices. All notices, demands, bills, statements or other communicationg under these Bylaws shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if delivered personally or if sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid (or otherwise as the Act may permit), (i) if to a Unit Owner, at the single addrese which the Unit Owner ghall designate in writing and file with the Secretary or, if no such addrese is designated, at the address of the Onit of such Unit Owner, or (ii) to the Association, the Executive Board or to the Managing Agent, if any, at the principal office of the Managing Agent or at auch other addreas as ghall be designated by notice in writing to the Unit Owners pursuant to this Section. If a Unit is owned by more than one Person, each such Person who so deaignates a gingle address in writing to the Secretary shail be entitled to receive all notices hereunder.

Section 8.2 Captiong. The captions herein are inserted only as a matter of convenience and for reference, and in no way define, limit or describe the scope of these Bylaws or the intent of any prowision thereof.
section B. 3 Gender. The use of the masculine gender in these Bylaws shall be deemed to include the feminine and neuter genders and the uee of the singular shall be deemed to include the plural, and vice versa, whenever the context so requixes.
