			Does the contractor have personal injury liability insurance?
			Does the contractor have property damage insurance?
			If complex plumbing is involved, does the contractor have a Master Plumber's License required by the County?
			If complex electrical work is involved, does the contractor have an Electrical Trade License required by the City?
			If complex HVAC/heat pump work is involved, does the contractor have a Mechanical Trade License required by the City?
			For larger projects, did you obtain written estimates (recommend three) from contractors?
			Have you obtained several recommendations (recommend three) from others satisfied for the type of work planned in your unit?
			Have you checked that the contractor has a positive rating with the Better Business Bureau?
			Do you have a written contract (signed by you and contractor) that includes the total price of the project, estimated start and completion dates, a description of the work, payment schedule?
